# LORD GRIFFITHS OF BURRY PORT

#### **Our Guest Speaker at the County Dinner**

The Reverend and Right Honourable the Lord Griffiths of Burry Port, who has been introduced to the Society by John Travell, is a Methodist minister, politician and life peer. He



served as an opposition spokesman and whip in the House of Lords from 2017 to 2020, having served as the President of the Methodist Conference from 1994 to 1995. Born in Burry Port, Carmarthenshire in February, 1942, he was educated at Llanelli Grammar School before studying at Cardiff University.

Burry Port is a small coastal town which owes much of its history to the coal trade and is also the place where Amelia Earhart landed at the end of her solo flight across the Atlantic.

Leslie became a local Methodist preacher in 1963 and while training for the ministry completed an MA in Theology at Fitzwilliam, Cambridge. Spending most of the 1970s in Haiti, where he was ordained, he returned to England to serve in Caversham, Loughton and Golders Green. He completed a PhD in 1987.

Retiring from his final position as superintendent of Wesley's Chapel in London, Leslie was created Baron Griffiths of Burry Port and Pembury in the County of Dyfed in 2004.

Leslie is an entertaining and accomplished speaker and we are pleased to welcome him to our annual County Dinner.
