#### **FROM THE PRESIDENT**

At the Society of Dorset Men's AGM on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> October it was a huge honour to be asked to take over the presidency of the Society of Dorset Men, and somewhat daunting to be stepping into the shoes of Julian Fellowes. I must congratulate and thank Julian, and indeed that other vital team member, Lady Emma, for all they have done in heading up our ancient Society for the last thirteen years.

I feel it might be a good move to briefly introduce myself. Notwithstanding the name, 'Angus Campbell', I have been brought up in Dorset. My father retired from the army shortly after the War and, as there was no work for him in Argyllshire, he settled in Dorset and started an agricultural contracting business in Shroton. The family then purchased Preston Hill Farm in the Parish of Iwerne Minster.

At the age of 20 I decided to put down my £10 and emigrate to New Zealand to work for the Auckland Herd Improvement Association for two years and, whilst there, I was lucky enough to acquire my Private Pilot's Licence.

Returning to the UK I joined the Army, via RMA Sandhurst, as a Military Helicopter Pilot and served a somewhat elongated short service commission in the Army Air Corps serving in Germany, Northern Ireland, Cyprus and Canada. On retirement I returned to farming in Dorset.

Developing an interest in local government I became Leader of North Dorset District Council, going on to become Leader of Dorset County Council and finally retiring in 2013. At that point I was extremely lucky to be asked to be The Lord-Lieutenant representing the Crown in Dorset and served for over ten and a half years in that position until reaching my mandatory retirement age of 75 in September this year. Much happened over the time of my service including Covid, the sad loss of the late Duke of Edinburgh, the Platinum Jubilee, the tremendous sadness of the passing of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second, followed by the Joy of the Coronation of King Charles the Third.

### **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

He also reported that the Year Book had been a great success in the capable hands of John Newth who had brought his professional skills to its production and a significant reduction of costs.

Last year's committee were re-elected *en bloc* with the addition of new members, Paul Bompas and John Beashel.




It was resolved:
